Studying in Germany

In most cases, refugees with fully recognized legal status (asylum granted, refugee protection, etc.) can access higher education in Germany and study at universities if they meet the usual admission requirements for their chosen program.

With its exclusive focus on the theater arts and its own studio theater, the university provides outstanding training in the fields of acting, directing, and contemporary puppetry. The master's programs in dramaturgy, choreography, and spiel & objekt expand this offering and aim to develop new narrative forms and realize aesthetic experiments within the framework of interdisciplinary artistic research.

While artistic talent is a key element for admission, German language skills are also an important requirement for application. Some programs require a German C1 certificate, so be sure to check the specific language requirements for your chosen program. You'll find more information about each program, including application deadlines and required documents, on our website.

The Ernst Busch is an international, inclusive educational institution. Persons from different countries



and various cultural backgrounds study, teach and work together. It is our responsibility as a university community to provide a safe environment and ideal dialog spaces for all. We actively support artists at risk, partnering with foundations and government representatives to offer scholarships and integration opportunities.

For all enrolled international students who want to improve their German language skills (especially phonetics), we offer the course "German as foreign language". Many Berlin universities offer study preparation and German courses for people with refugee status. Attending these courses can be helpful before applying to any program.
